

The Jubilee Family Camp

25th-27th May 2012



The Plan

- To host the royal visit to Boyd Memorial Campsite, Friday 25th May 2012 until Sunday 27th May 2012. Campers are to prepare for the visit of the royal couple, ensuring they have a castle fit for a King and Queen and plenty of food and entertainment which will satisfy their needs.



The Details

- At the start of the camp timetable a King and a Queen will be selected by picking two names out of two bags - male and female. (This is done in secret)
- The Campers will be split into two teams, trying to keep families together as much as possible.
- Each team will have team leaders (scouts) who are responsible for the time and management of their teams.
- The team's main mission is to build a castle using natural resources
 - Facilities may be constructed to make the royal stay more comfortable.
ie toilets, seating, beds, tables, clothes lines etc.
- Smaller teams will be subtracted for small periods to complete tasks to ensure the formalities of the visit are a success, as follows:-

- Attend the archery site to shoot their way to victory awarded with a pouch of food for their evening feast and for it to be cooked by someone else.
- To improve on your accuracy, practise your precision work on the range with air rifles.
- Or maybe Nerf target shooting is the preferred option.
- Attend the lake and help erect *HMS Jubilee* and sail across to see what treasures lay the other side for them.
- For the evening entertainment the King and Queen will be able to sit on their own thrones made by jubilee campers.
- The royal gowns and crowns need to be prepared and presented to royalty.
- The jokers and musicians will need to arrange entertainment for the royal couple.
- The campers are to make Union Flags to wave for every royal attendance.
- Ensure that the royal visitors have sedan chairs to transport them during their stay.
- Security teams will need to conduct check points visits and remove any visual implement that may cause unnecessary ease with the royal couple. Map and compass needed.
- Before royalty is presented with any meats in the feast, groups will need to check the meat content, ensuring that they cook it in an unconventional way and taste the meat themselves.
- Collections teams to stock up the fire to keep the King and Queen warm at night



- In the late afternoon all campers are invited to take part in *The Jubilee Water Chariots Challenge*, when Beavers, Cubs and Scouts can compete against mums and dads in a sedan chair obstacle course and racing HMS Jubilee rafts across the lake.

- In the evening, for the hog roast, we're hosting a '*Jubilee street party*', with trestle tables set up for us all to eat together, which the King and Queen will preside over.
- After this, our minstrels and musicians will be entertaining our royal visitors with sketches, songs and music around the camp fire.

Essential Information

Food

- Campers will be responsible where viable for their own food at meal times except for the Saturday evening hog roast which will be provided by the catering team, who will also provide hot water for hot drinks for the duration of the camp.
- There is a fish and chip shop in Henlow which we plan on making use of on Friday evening.

The camp site

- The sites we have booked are right next to the car park and trolleys will be available to transport your belongings.
- Toilet and showers facilities are provided by Campsite.
- There is a small shop which will be available to us, dependent on opening times.
- We have booked a hut for our use, in case of bad weather.
